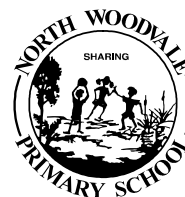

MULTILIT READING TUTOR PROGRAM

The Centre for Inclusive Schooling (CIS) is offering a discounted workshop on the Multilit Reading Tutor Program (\$170- normally \$330). The program involves intensive (one-to-one), systematic reading instruction for children who are struggling to learn how to read and caters for students from Years 2 (about 7 years) to adult. It comprises three key features: phonics or word attack skills; sight words recognition and supported book reading in a one-to-one context.
