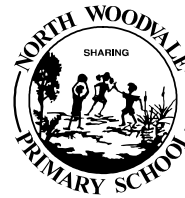

We look forward to our next NWPS Little Learners which will be held on Friday 19th June. Please register for the session in the school admin office.

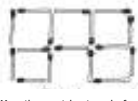

DICE GAMES

It was great working with the Yr 1's this week. They are working on recognising numbers instantly (subitizing) to help them add up quickly. This instant recall of number facts takes time to become proficient in.

Initially the children will count all the dots on both dice to find the answer.

As they become more confident they instantly recognise one number (the largest number) and then count on from that to get their answer ie I see a six and a four so counting on from six this is 7,8,9,10.

The most proficient stage is when the children don't need to count; they see the two numbers and know the answer without any counting to all.

Have fun and practice these skills with your children.
