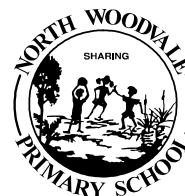

Stay tuned as we continue to focus on maths in a hands on fun way.

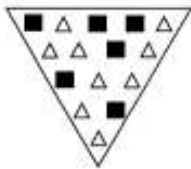


### YEAR 1 DICE GAMES

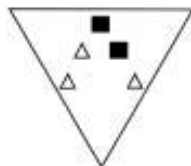
Ms Lockhart's students play dice games every morning as part of their discovery time.
