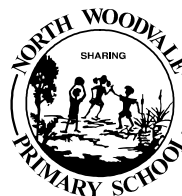

Have-a-go at creating a tessellation. When you have created one bring it into the office to show Mrs Spencer.

2 Creating a Tessellation

To create a tessellation, follow these steps.

1. Cut a rectangle out of cardboard.
2. Cut a shape (bite) out of one side of the rectangle. Be careful not to cut any corner.
3. Tape the bite to the opposite side of the rectangle, in a position exactly opposite from where the bite was cut.
4. Cut another shape (bite) from another side of the rectangle and tape the bite to the opposite side of the rectangle as before.
5. Outline this new shape on a piece of cardboard and cut it out. Use it to make a pattern that tiles a plane.



6. Decorate each figure in the pattern.

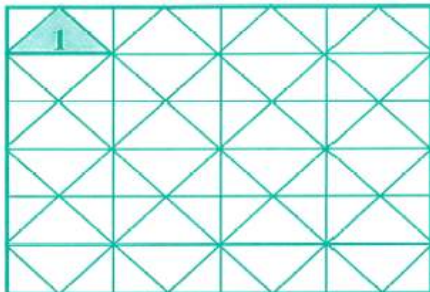
Things to consider

- Instead of starting with a rectangle, you could have started with a square or a parallelogram and followed the same steps.
- Escher was a Dutch artist who used this technique. Look on the internet for some of his art.

3 Colour a Shape

See if you can find each of these in the design. Fill in the shape, and mark it with the matching number.

1. triangle – isosceles
2. triangle – scalene
3. rectangle
4. rhombus



5. pentagon
6. hexagon
7. heptagon
8. octagon

4 Fold and Cut

You will need some coloured paper, sticky tape and scissors.

- ✓ Fold the paper in half lengthwise and then in half widthways.



- ✓ Cut a pattern into the folded shape and then open it up and stick it onto some backing paper.
